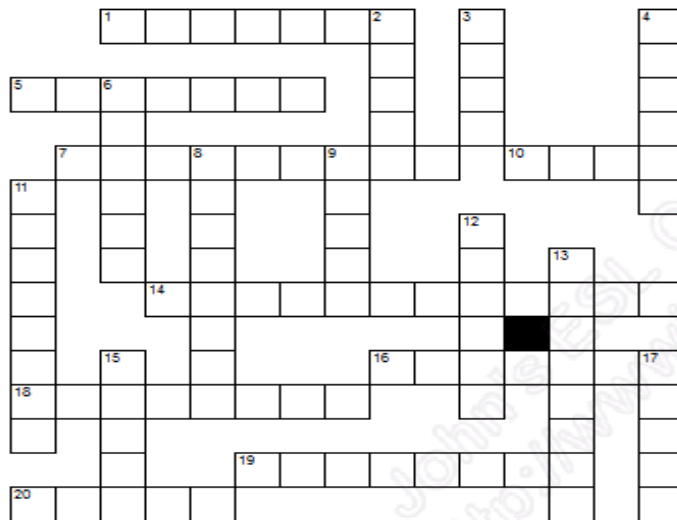

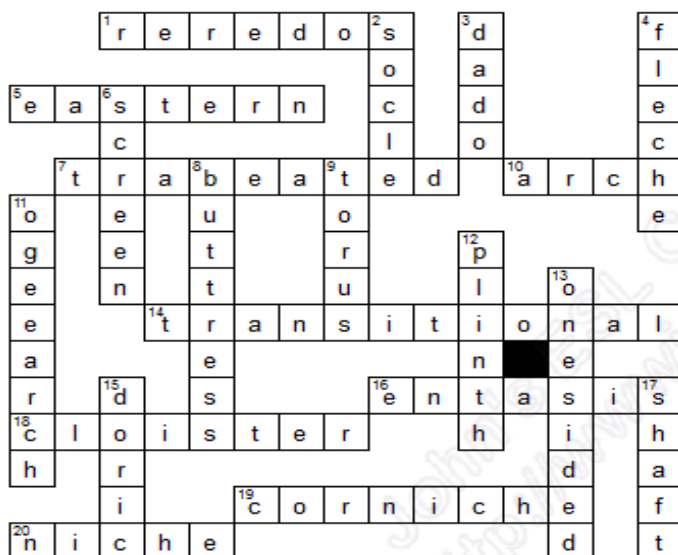
Across

1. A painted or carved screen placed above and behind an altar or communion table.
5. Lying toward or situated in the east.
7. Not arcuate; having straight horizontal beams or lintels (rather than arches).
10. A curved shape in the vertical plane that spans an opening.
14. Of or relating to or characterized by transition.
16. A slight bulge in the shaft of a column.
18. A courtyard with covered walks.
19. A road that winds along the side of a steep coast or cliff.
20. An enclosure that is set back or indented.

2. A plain plinth that supports a wall.
3. Panel forming the lower part of an interior wall when it is finished differently from the rest.
4. A slender spire, especially one that emerges from the roof of a church at the point where the ridges intersect.
6. Protective covering consisting of a metallic netting mounted in a frame and covering windows or doors.
8. A support usually of stone or brick; supports the wall of a building.
9. The lowest molding at the base of a column.
11. A pointed arch having an S-shape on both sides.

14. Of or relating to or characterized by transition. [transitional]
16. A slight bulge in the shaft of a column. [entasis]
18. A courtyard with covered walks. [cloister]
19. A road that winds along the side of a steep coast or cliff. [corniche]
20. An enclosure that is set back or indented. [niche]

2. A plain plinth that supports a wall. [socle]
3. Panel forming the lower part of an interior wall when it is finished differently from the rest. [dado]
4. A slender spire, especially one that emerges from the roof of a church at the point where the ridges intersect. [fleche]
6. Protective covering consisting of a metallic netting mounted in a frame and covering windows or doors. [screen]
8. A support usually of stone or brick; supports the wall of a building. [buttress]
9. The lowest molding at the base of a column. [torus]
11. A pointed arch having an S-shape on both sides. [ogee arch]
12. An architectural support or base. [plinth]
13. Out of proportion in shape. [onesided]
15. Oldest and simplest of the three orders of classical Greek architecture. [doric]
17. A vertical passageway through a building. [shaft]
